The instructional materials used in this grant demonstrate students to explore and expand their reading fluency and comprehension.


Students had the opportunity to be actively involved in reading at their own level and ability.

Reading Wallet

For every 5 books read student get the next stamp in their wallet.

1st set: Lower Case alphabet letters



2nd set: Numbers 1-10



3rd set: Capital alphabet letters



4th set: Color each bug

Keeping Track of Books

Students receive a card with a letter of the alphabet to hang on their hook for every 5 books read successfully.

1st set – lower case letters


2nd set – Numbers 1-10

3rd set – upper case letters




Students stamp the same letter in their reading wallets to keep track of the number of books read.





Each student has a lanyard and a hook under it. The lanyard is for each time a student gets into a club (after reading 25 books) and the hook is for the letter of the alphabet card for every 5 books read.













AR Reading Time

The Ambridge Area School District has been very busy applying for grants across the district. Teachers and administrators have been working hard to find opportunities for our students. The grants have been coming in from local and federal funds to allow us the chance to enrich our existing curriculum. Grants awarded in the last three months alone total almost \$25,000.00. Congratulations to everyone who helped secure these funds and bring more opportunities to our students. Below is a comprehensive list of some of the grants awarded this school year:

- 2016-2017 Safe Schools Initiative Targeted Equipment Grant in the amount of \$17,700.00 from the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The purpose of the grant is to provide security equipment to schools. We are authorized to purchase the Raptor Visitor Management System. This will be implemented in all five buildings. Major efforts to secure this grant were done by Travis Mineard and Lori Heim with the assistance of John Booher.
- 2016 McDonald's MAC Grant in the amount of \$500.00 from The MAC Grants Program, an initiative sponsored by local McDonald's Owner/Operators. Beginning this week you will see a change to your child's "Buggy for Reading" incentive reading program.

By the generous support of The Beaver County Educational Trust and Lincoln Learning Solutions. I was awarded a \$500.00 grant for our classroom this year. My proposal is entitled "Buggy for Reading: A-Z Reading Adventure."

This proposal is designed to get my first grade students excited about reading with rewards and incentives. They are currently doing a great job with reading, but I believe this added touch will motivate them to read more daily.

A reading wallet has now replaced the baggie your child has been bringing home. Please be sure that the reading wallet, along with the book, comes to and from school daily. Buggy book bucks have replaced the stamp book we were using. As your child successfully reads a book he/she will earn a book buck. Students can redeem book bucks for rewards and prizes. For every 5 books your child reads, he/she is given an alphabet stamp in his/her reading wallet. Our goal is for each student to build the entire alphabet before the end of the year.

Thanks to this grant opportunity, I have been able to buy the materials needed to make the reading wallets, purchase 50 new Accelerated Reader books (to give students more choices of reading materials at the appropriate levels), and rewards.



Buggy for Reading: An A-Z Reading Adventure Budget for Carrie Malinich

I had the following materials on hand and didn't need to buy them to complete the grant; therefore, I was able to shift the money to purchase more Accelerated Readers books at a wider range of levels.

The following materials I had on hand and didn't need to purchase:

- A class set of brown bags
- Foam shapes
- Clear packaging tape
- Necklaces (I had lanyards instead)
- Pipe cleaners
- Hair bands
- Organizer (I had two smaller ones on hand that worked)

The following items were no longer available to purchase:

- Number stamps
- Reading sticks

I originally proposed to purchase 40 books at the very beginning levels 0.3-1.0. With the adjustment of funds due to having some materials on hand, I was able to purchase approximately 108 books at a range from 0.3-2.0. This gives my students a wider variety of book choices to read at their given levels.
